"Dignitas Infinita" (The Infinite Dignity of Human beings, April 8, 2024, Declaration for the Doctrine of the faith, Vatican City, Italy.)

Three fundamental concepts of human dignity":

1. Human dignity. Human beings are "willed" to exist, created and loved by God. By being human all are made in the image and likeness of God and are to be treated with a basic respect and a dignity as children loved by God.
2. Moral dignity. Human freedom is not merely a capacity to choose between one option or another, but is more accurately understood as the capacity to grow and perfect oneself in accordance with Divine Will and choices made correctly that affect the individual and others. (Making righteous choices gives us more freedom and dignity.) Freedom is not absolute but in accordance to the Law (Commandments of God) and to one's natural and genetic birth.
3. Social dignity. Focuses on the social conditions in which people live. All human beings are entitled by God to live with basic resources: clean water, adequate nutrition, basic health services, basic shelter, and basic fundamental human rights.

"Respect for the dignity of each and every person is the indispensable basis for the very existence of any society which claims to be founded on just law and not on the force of power."
