

January 21 - Inaugural March for Life, Natchitoches!

Save the date for the first of an annual March for Life in Natchitoches. St. Mary's Catholic School and the Minor Basilica of the Immaculate Conception Church, in partnership with the Women's Resource Center, will host a March for Life on Friday, Jan. 21. January 22 - National Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children."

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms. Another way to take part is through participating in special events to observe the anniversary of Roe v. Wade.
