

Again and again in his letter, James commands Christians to put faith into action. Today we hear an explicit warning: "Behold, the wages you withheld from the workers who harvested your fields are crying aloud: and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts". For us to store up treasure is sinful. Let us imitate the generosity of the Father, as we have seen in so many of Jesus' parables, working toward a world where everyone from migrant workers who literally harvest our nation's fields to those who cannot seem to break out of the cycle of poverty are compensated with a just wage.

In the Gospel, Jesus gives his disciples pause when they accuse a stranger of appropriating their ministry. He turns the tables on them, absolving anyone who does good in his name while condemning them if they have something in themselves that causes them to sin. Do not judge others' motivations; look at your own. Then cut away those things that lead you to sin.

In what way am I like the one who stores up treasure? In what way am I like the one whose wages are withheld? What can I do from my position to properly reflect the lessons Jesus taught?
